Ngqushwa Local Municipality convened its first Council sitting on the 22 November 2021 at Ncumisa Kondlo Indoor Sports Centre to inaugurate new Councillors for the five year term of 2021 to 2026. The Sports Centre was fully occupied as stakeholders came in numbers to witness the significant day of inauguration and swearing in of the new Councillors. The Municipal Manager, Mr. Ndoda Mgengo presided over the proceedings as part of the session allowed new Councillors to introduce themselves to the members of the community and stakeholders of the municipality.

His opening remarks focused on "working together to do more in reducing the challenges facing the municipality in relation to poverty and unemployment which continues to plague the lives of the community of Ngqushwa. He also call upon to new councillors, to concentrate their energies on finding ways of addressing the existing weaknesses facing our municipality as well as to ensure that the municipality achieves its mandate as enshrined in Section 152 of our Constitution."

The process of swearing in of Councillors continued and finished with a total of 23 Councillors taking the oath/solemn affirmation and constituting the Municipal Council, structured in the following manner; 18 African National Congress (ANC), 3 Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF), 1 Democratic Alliance (DA) and 1 Independent Councillor.

At this point, the Ward Councillor for Ward 12, Councillor Daniswa Ncanywa was nominated and elected as the Speaker of the municipality in line with the provisions of schedule three (3) of the Local Government Municipal Structures Act, 117 Of 1998, as amended. After having given her expression of sense of honour, she thereafter took over and presided over the remainder of the Agenda starting with the nomination and election of the Mayor.

Councillor Sanga Siyabulela Maneli was elected as the Mayor of Ngqushwa Local Municipality. In his welcoming address and expression of sense of

honour the newly elected Mayor of Ngqushwa Local Municipality said, "the entire Council is ready to serve all communities of the municipality among others, he mentioned and committed to the community that water, electricity and roads infrastructure shall remain the Councils primary focus towards service delivery. He also committed to work as a team with administration to bring better audits.'

In the previous term, Councillor Sanga Siyabulela Maneli, served as the Executive Committee Member for Corporate Services Portfolio, acted as the Mayor and later sworn in as Council Speaker until the end of the previous

Elections of Councils representatives was undertaken in line with paragraph 16 of Schedule 2 of the municipal Structures Act and the following Councillors ely; Sanga Siyabulela Maneli, Daniswa Ncanywa and Councillor Zolar Ndonga were elected to serve in the Amathole District Municipality.

A Special Council meeting was held on the 26th November 2021 where Council Committees were constituted. As part of the programme of Council meeting. The Executive Committee which is the principal committee of Council which receives report from portfolio committees of Council was constituted to comprise of Mayor Councillor Maneli, who is also the Chairperson of the Committee, Councillor Anathi Nodikida (Community Services Portfolio), Councillor Zolani Ndonga (Technical Services Portfolio) and Councillor Lindiwe Mdabula (Corporate Service, Budget and Treasury Portfolios).

In line with its delegated powers, the Executive Committee considers reports and disposes the same together with its recommendations to the municipal Council for a decision/resolution.
