

# **MAY 2025**

### Ngqushwa municipality engaged communities and adopted the 2025/26 IDP and budget

Councillors and Municipal Administration undertook an extensive community engagement programme across all 12 wards as part of the annual review of the Integrated Development Plan (IDP) and municipal budget for the 2025/26 financial year. The initiative, guided by legislation that mandates a five-year IDP with annual reviews, aimed to ensure that service delivery remains aligned with the evolving needs of the community.

The final IDP was approved by the Council on the 29 May 2025. Outline of key development initiatives to be implemented by the municipality and various sector departments for the 2025/26 financial year. The Municipality is generating its internal revenue from rates, refuse, rentals and other sources.

## 2024/25 MDRG AND MIG SERVICE DELIVERY PROJECTS

### Flood-damaged roads restored with COGTA's Municipal Disaster **Relief Grant**

Ngqushwa Local Municipality has made a significant progress in restoring road infrastructure damaged by floods that occurred during 2023/24 financial year. The extreme weather affected 65 kilometres of roads and stormwater systems across 25 villages in Wards 2, 4, 5, 6,7,8 and 9.

With the allocated fund of R35, 586 000 received from COGTA's Municipal Disaster Recovery Grant, the Municipality undertook repairs that include re-gravelling of roads, standardizing widths to 6 meters, repairing stormwater structures and implementing erosion control measures like stone pitching in disaster-stricken areas.

The repair work was successfully completed within budget, restoring safe and reliable access for communities and enhancing resilience to future weather events. Residents across the affected wards have welcomed the improvements and commended the municipality's response and commitment to infrastructure recovery.

#### Ngqushwa Council delivered on 2024/25 infrastructure service delivery

Since the current Council came into power in November 2021, they pledged, prioritized to address community needs through a comprehensive developmental approach. Indeed, in January 2022 a needs verification assessment to collect information of projects and needs in every ward village. Through the guidance of community engagements, the municipality implemented a five-year Integrated Development Plan with 60 capital projects that are reviewed annually.

In the financial year 2024/25, a grant funding of R25.8 million was allocated through the Municipal Infrastructure Grant for infrastructure projects in various wards. The major highlights are electricity projects (high mast lights), grading and construction of gravel internal streets, upgrade of the Peddie Extension Sports field, five newly designed community halls with admin office, kitchen, ablution facilities, disability access to enable community engagement and events.

Mayor Sanga Maneli complimented the active involvement of community members in monitoring the projects and ensuring contractors deliver services that meet their expectations. He further confirmed the municipality's commitment to accelerate service delivery for the people of Nggushwa. Community members were happy and expressed satisfaction with the new facilities and committed to their upkeep.

The Municipality is proud to announce the successful completion of key projects that address identified community needs.

# **08 NOVEMBER 2024**

### Sod turning ceremony marks the start of new municipal office building construction

In October 2024, Ngqushwa Local Municipality reached a major milestone with the official sod-turning ceremony for the construction of a new office building within the Municipality site. The ceremony led by Mayor Sanga Maneli was attended by Councillors, traditional leader Chief Zola Njokweni, municipal employees and community members.

Ngqushwa Local Municipality appointed Kukho Consulting Engineers to provide professional services for the planning, design and costing of the new municipality office within the municipality site.

The objective of the project is to expand office space for the Municipality to accommodate operational duties of municipal staff for service delivery..

Speaking at the ceremony, Mayor Maneli emphasized the significance of the project, that "our core responsibility is to serve the 108 Ngqushwa villages. Despite the limited resources, the council took a resolution to put aside funds to make sure that employees are comfortable to perform their duties.

He further said" the new office building is the stepping stone towards planting a seed to have a full office park in future that will accommodate all government departments in Ngqushwa and help boost the revenue

The new building is 143m<sup>2</sup> in size with six fully equipped municipal offices, reception and waiting area, Boardroom, Kitchen, Separate male and female ablution rooms and a safe room.

The total project value is R6.983 million with construction scheduled to take six months.

The development reflects Ngqushwa Municipality's continued commitment to enhancing internal capacity and providing accessible, quality services to its communities.



# 07 APRIL 2025

### Premier Mabuyane led an oversight visit on N2 road construction project

In a significant demonstration of government commitment to infrastructure development, Eastern Cape Premier Oscar Mabuyane conducted an oversight visit to the SANRAL road construction project along the N2, between Makhanda (formerly Grahamstown) and Peddie on the 7 April 2025. The visit aimed to monitor progress on this vital transport corridor, which connects key regions in the province.

Premier Mabuyane was joined by Ngqushwa Local Municipality Mayor, Cllr. Sanga Maneli, Ngqushwa Executive Committee Members, Ward 9 Councillor Cllr. N. Mtati, and Municipal Manager Mr. N. Mgengo. The site visit provided an opportunity for stakeholders to assess the quality of work, adherence to timelines, and the project's impact on local communities.

The Premier commended the work done thus far and emphasized that the SANRAL led infrastructure project is more than just laying tarmacadam, it is about driving economic growth, ensuring safer travel, and improving access to essential services. With features such as climbing lanes, improved road alignment, and community access roads, the upgrade is expected to boost tourism, unlock trade, and most importantly connect people to greater opportunities.

"This road is not just infrastructure it's a lifeline," said Premier Mabuyane. "We remain committed to overseeing its completion and ensuring it brings real change to the people of the Eastern Cape."

#### Ngqushwa municipality empowers local SMME's through equipment support

### Food safety training for hawker stalls owners and cooperatives

Ngqushwa Local Municipality in collaboration with Wholesale & Retail Seta and Mhonto Educational Foundation rolled out a focused Food Safety Training for local hawker stall owners and cooperatives operating within the municipal area.

The training was aimed at empowering informal traders and cooperative members with the knowledge and skills necessary to handle, prepare, and sell food in a safe and hygienic manner. The initiative forms part of the Municipality's commitment in enhancing public health standards and supporting small business development as key drivers of the local economy.



The programme addressed the critical gap in informal trading ensuring that food sold in our communities is safe and prepared in a hygienic environment, equipping traders with these skills not only public health is protected but also the quality and competitiveness of local economy is improved.

Practical demonstrations on hygiene practices, food storage, waste management, and compliance with local and national health regulations were done. Participants will receive certificates upon successful completion of the training, further legitimizing their operations and enhancing consumer trust.

The Municipality will continue to seek partnerships that contribute to building a skilled, empowered, and economically active community.





### **25 FEBRUARY 2025**

### Ngqushwa local municipality celebrated Aviwe Sofoyiya's **Mathematics Practice Manual 1&2**

From the humble village of Gwalana in Ngqushwa, to national recognition as a mathematics author and academic, Ms. Aviwe Sofoyiya is a beacon of inspiration for the youth of Ngqushwa.

Ngqushwa Local Municipality proudly hosted a book launch on 25 February 2025 to celebrate Ms. Sofoyiya's remarkable achievements. At the event, she officially unveiled Part 1 and Part 2 of her Grade 12 Mathematics Practice Manual, which aims to support high school learners in improving their mathematics performance and unlocking further academic opportunities.

Aviwe's journey is a powerful testament to perseverance. Despite her rural upbringing, she refused to let her circumstances define her future. Initially pursuing a Degree in Maritime Studies at the Durban University of Technology (DUT), Aviwe later followed her true passion for mathematics, earning an Advanced Diploma in Mathematical Sciences from the Cape Peninsula University of Technology (CPUT).

Now 28 years old, Ms. Sofoyiya is not only a qualified mathematical scientist and author but also the founder of an upcoming online mathematics academy. This initiative is designed to support both school learners and tertiary students especially those from rural areas who face challenges in mastering the subject.

Aviwe's self-published manual, produced in collaboration with Evelyn50 Publishing Company in Johannesburg, was developed in 2023 and officially released for sale on 11 July 2024. Priced at an accessible R400 for both parts, the manual breaks down complex concepts into learner-friendly content, bridging gaps in understanding and fostering confidence in mathematics.

Ngqushwa Local Municipality Mayor, Cllr. Sanga Maneli, applauded Ms. Aviwe Sofoyiya for her remarkable contribution to education and for bringing pride to the municipality. He described her as a shining example of how dedication, resilience, and passion can break barriers and inspire transformation within communities. In support of her initiative, Mayor Maneli pledged to purchase 167 copies of the Mathematics Practice Manual for all grade 12 learners currently studying mathematics in Ngqushwa schools. Additionally, Mayor Maneli committed R1,000 worth of airtime to promote public voting in support of Ms. Sofoyiya's participation in Mzantsi Arts and Media Awards (MAMA).

Mr Cakata from the Department of Education (Amathole West District) also expressed strong support by purchasing copies of the manual that will be useful for each school in Nggushwa that offers mathematics subject to assist learners in improving their academic outcomes.



## 10 OCTOBER 2024

### Ngqushwa municipality supported matric learners through school adoption initiative

In 2023 financial year, Mayor Sanga Maneli launched a school adoption initiative programme aimed at improving matric (grade 12) performance in schools that obtained average results. Following the success of the initiative the programme was extended in 2024 to three schools, and all the schools adopted showed improvement in the 2024 matric results compared to the previous year which demonstrated the positive impact of the initiative.

Qhayiya Secondary School in Glenmore went from 68.4% to 71.4%, Sakuphumelela Secondary School in Zalarha showed a huge improvement from 43.7% to 71.7% and Lingelethu High School in Mdolomba achieved from 66.9% to 92.7%. In each of the selected schools, the municipality contributed groceries to support learners who camp at school during the final examinations.

During the school visits, the Executive Committee members engaged with teachers, School Governing Bodies (SGBs) and parents understanding the social and security environment in schools and therefore encouraging a collaborative environment that can help drive success of the initiative putting emphasis that all Grade 12 learners regardless of their background must benefit from the programme. Mayor Maneli further highlighted the importance of education and empowered learners with knowledge, skills and be critical thinkers to understand the world and make informed decisions. Lastly, he encouraged learners to stay focused and avoid harmful substances like alcohol and drugs.

Parents expressed gratitude for the municipality's support and committed themselves to work closely with teachers to achieve improved results.

### Boxing kit donated to support local talent

In showing support for youth development through sport; KB Promotions, in partnership with Pepzin Promotions from East London, donated boxing gloves and kits to Nggushwa Local Municipality on the 10 October 2024. The generous donation aims to encourage young people in Ngqushwa to participate in boxing as it is a full body workout for mental and physical health.

She further said, the equipment will benefit local boxing clubs across Ngqushwa, grow youth through boxing sport in our communities. # 14 MAY 2025

#### Historic milestone: uMqwashu declared a national heritage site

The Eastern Cape Province celebrated a momentous occasion, wherein the iconic uMqwashu heritage site was officially declared a National Heritage Site. This follows a 2023 application submitted by Ngqushwa Local Municipality in collaboration with the uMqwashu Committee to the South African Heritage Resources Agency (SAHRA). The Premier of the Eastern Cape Honourable Lubabalo Oscar Mabuyane officiated the legacy of "uMqwashu" that dates back to 14 May 1835, when the amaMfengu, displaced by the Mfecane and seeking refuge from conflict under King Hintsa near Butterworth, settled near Peddie on land provided by the British.

The 190th anniversary in commemorating the historic recognition was attended dignitaries including Deputy Minister of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs, Prince Zolile Burns-Ncamashe, Ngqushwa Council led by Mayor Sanga Maneli, representatives from SAHRA, the Provincial House of Traditional Leaders, Imbumbe Melizwe ka Dlamini Kingdom (KZN), the Rharhabe Kingdom, the Amahlubi King's Council, Amamfengu Aphesheya Kwenciba, various stakeholders and Ngqushwa community at large.

The Premier in his address said, "Umqwashu is more than just a Tree, but a living testament to the rich history, cultural identity, and healing traditions of African communities. Deeply rooted in the medicinal and spiritual heritage of the region, it stands as a symbol of hope, unity, remembrance and renewal. Therefore, let us build the Eastern Cape we want and prosper as the province."The celebration was held under the powerful theme: "Izifungo zamaMfengu – Honoring the Past, Empowering the Future."
